I have been making things out of sand, plasticine, wood and wire for as long as I can remember; moved by the shape of things, as I continue to be, and their presence in space. Sculpture studies in the Academia in Florence were followed by five years at art school. It was during this period I met my husband, Robert, and moved to England.

I use paper, cardboard and wire for low reliefs that are not meant to be cast, drawing for immediacy, plaster of paris when I sculpt; chipping away after moulding the basic shape. I always think of the final piece in bronze. This is like sculpting in stone but quicker and with a greater degree of freedom as there are virtually no limitations on shape.

The exploration of the human form has always been important to my work. I never see the body in a purely representational way but as a retainer of human emotion, touching in its combination of fragility and strength. Henry Moore found the female form pivotal in his work; Liz Frink the male. In my work they are of equal importance and often dependent on one another.

In Lovers I look at the sexual act, intimate and individual and yet common to all, repeated again and again like a thread through time.

In the metamorphic figures I recognise the need in all of us to protect our inner being, the need for camouflage, and ultimately our isolation.

MARZIA COLONNA

Born 1951 in Pisa, Italy Marzia Colonna was accepted into art school at the age of twelve. This was followed by the Academia Di Belle Arte, Florence, and then a move to England with her husband in 1970. Work initially concentrated on drawing and sculpture. Her first solo exhibition in London was held at Campbell and Franks in 1979. Subsequently her work developed into an exploration of the body through colour and collage. Exploration of the human form continued with patterns merging as the body becomes landscape. A move to Dorset in 1985 resulted in Liz Frink becoming a close friend.

Reference to the human body remains a constant in Colonna's work. In her sculpture and low reliefs on which she has worked exclusively from 1993 her work is at its strongest. Here friezes and bronze twist as elements of landscape. Mythical and metamorphic elements turn a torso into a tail.












