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Olivia Fraser's work though following the centuries old Indian miniature painting tradition has undoubtedly chartered its own course, reinventing it and giving it a contemporary feel.

What distinguishes her work is the specific imagery picked up from the miniatures, working on the reductive approach, thereby bringing out the essence, like a thousand petalled lotus transformed into a moving hypnotic element. And as one absorbs her work, it is like entering into the realm of meditation, a *sacred garden*, making it difficult to pull away.

The fundamentals of the miniature painting remain - using the stone and plant pigments, burnished till the painting glows but her art essentially at some level crosses boundaries so that it is no longer completely Eastern.

Like the famed James Baillie Fraser, she is also blazing a trail on the Indian soil. It is a great pleasure to bring Olivia Fraser to Chandigarh and host her first exhibition in the city.








Pilgrimage, 2010-2011






Yantra, 2014
Stone pigment and Arabic gum on handmade Sanganer paper 26 x 26 inches




Chakra-I, 2013


Chakra-II, 2013










Lotus Eyes, 2016 Stone Pigment, Arabic gum and gold leaf on handmade Sanganer paper 22 x 44 inches






1000 Petals (Red) 2016 Stone pigment and Arabic gum on handmade Sanganer paper 36 x 36 inches

After graduating with a MA in Modern Languages from Oxford, Olivia spent a year at Wimbledon Art College before moving to India in 1989.

Following in the footsteps of her kinsman, James Baillie Fraser who painted India, its monuments and landscape in the early 1800's, Olivia set out to continue where her kinsman had left off, painting the architecture of Delhi and its people. James Baillie Fraser also commissioned local artists to paint what has become the famous 'Fraser Album' – the greatest masterpiece of Company School Painting portraying the different types of people and their jobs, crafts or castes against stark white backgrounds. This hybrid form of painting where Indian artists created works with mixed techniques and ideas from the East and West greatly influenced Olivia's early work during the 1990s.

In 2005 she decided to study the traditional Indian miniature painting techniques under Jaipuri and Delhi masters, and now uses this in her work with its gem-like stone colours, its unique miniature brush work, and its elaborate decorative and burnished surfaces. Having been especially influenced by Nathdwara pichhwai painting and early C19th Jodhpuri painting, Olivia has been exploring its visual language, reaching back to an archetypal iconography strongly rooted in India's artistic and cultural heritage that can breach borders and be relevant to her twin life between East and West.

Her latest body of works is deeply rooted in her fascination with and practice of yoga and the ways in which yogic meditation involves visualizations of the garden, particularly the sahasrara or thousandpetalled lotus, which serves as a visual aid in reaching enlightenment. "The garden, an enclosed and cultivated area of landscape that's formalized and acted upon, is fundamental to my work," she says. "I take the vocabulary of landscape - trees, flowers, rivers, mountains and sky - and I deconstruct and reduce them to their essence."

Her work has been shown in galleries and art fairs around the world. In 2015 she had her first solo show in New York and her work was also shown at the Venice Biennale. Her paintings are now in collections in India, UK, France, Belgium (Museum of Sacred Art), UAE, Singapore, Australia, China and the USA.

Olivia divides her time between Delhi and London.
