BIOGRAPHY

Arbit Blatas was born in Kaunas, Lithuania of Russian parents before the First World War. At the age of fifteen he was already exhibiting in his native country. Soon afterwards he left for Paris, and at the age of twenty-one was already the youngest member of the "School of Paris". When the Jeu de Paume acquired his first picture, he was twenty-four years of age and had become a colleague and friend of many of the great figures of Paris art life, such as Vlaminck, Soutine, Picasso, Utrillo, Braque, Zadkine, Léger, Derain. He was to paint and sculpt them all: Bonnard, Vuillard, Matisse, Dufy, Van Dongen, Cocteau, Marquet and many others. In 1947 Arbit Blatas was elected a life member of the Salon D'Automne. His thirty portraits in oil and bronze are considered a unique document of the painters and sculptors of that "School".

At the outbreak of World War II Blatas went to the United States, where he later became an American citizen. After returning to France, he became equally well-known as a sculptor, and in 1967 his life-size bronze of Soutine was purchased by André Malraux for the Orangerie in Paris. Blatas exhibits regularly in the principal galleries of New York, Paris and London. His work is found in some of the greatest private international art collections.

In collaboration with his wife, the opera singer and stage director Regina Resnik, he has designed nine productions for the operatic stage, among them Elektra (for the Teatro La Fenice in Venice); Carmen (in Hamburg); Salomé (for the Teatro Sao Carlos, Lisbon); Falstaff (for the Grand Theatre, Warsaw); The Queen of Spades (for the Sidney Opera House, Australia) and Falstaff (Venice).

In 1978 Arbit Blatas was awarded the honour of Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur by the French Government for his contribution to French art as an outstanding member of the "School of Paris".

On April 25th, 1980, the National Holiday of Liberation from the Nazis, the Monument of the Holocaust (seven bronze bas-reliefs) by Arbit Blatas was consecrated in the Historic Ghetto of Venice in the Campo del Ghetto Nuovo. The second edition of the work was dedicated in Paris at the Shrine of the Unknown Jewish Martyrs on April 23rd, 1981, the third one was placed by the Anti-Defamation League in the Dag Hammerskjold old Plaza facing the United Nations in New York, on April 25th, 1982.

In Venice, Blatas' "School of Paris" portraits became a major exhibition at the Church of San Samuele in 1982 under the auspices of the Mayor of Paris, Jacques Chirac and the Mayor of Venice, Mario Rigo. It was followed by the "Three Penny Opera" exhibition at the Teatro Goldoni in the same city in 1984. Paintings and sculptures of the "Three Penny Opera" were shown at the Museum of the City of New York and the Goethe Institute in Toronto, Canada, in 1986.

The Musée Bourdelle offered the first major exhibition of the "School of Paris" portraits in Paris in 1986, and the city of Paris celebrated the installation of the life-size statue of Chaim Soutine by Blatas in the Square Gaston Baty in Montparnasse for which Blatas received the Medaille de Vermeil of the City of Paris in 1987. The entire collection of the portraits, drawings, and bronzes of the "School of Paris" artists have now found their permanent home in the Musée Municipal in Boulogne-Billancourt. They were shown in 1990 and will be rededicated in the new museum to open in 1995 in rooms dedicated to Blatas. In addition, the life-size bronze of his friend, Jacques Lipschitz, now stands in the garden of the Hotel de Ville in Boulogne. The city of Paris recently presented this collection with great success in Montparnasse under the title "Memories of Paris".

On September 19th, 1993 Arbit Blatas was honoured by the President of Italy who personally dedicated his sculpture called "The Last Train" in the Historic Ghetto of Venice. The monument honours the fiftieth anniversary of the Deportation of the Holocaust.

Mr. Blatas and his wife, Regina Resnik, live and work all over the world but have permanent homes in New York City and Venice, Italy.


