Designs for over forty productions include Opera, Ballet, Film and Theatre. Principal work for The Royal Opera House – Covent Garden, Sadlers Wells, Old Vic, Royal Shakespeare Company, Royal Swedish Ballet, Théâtre Royal de la Monnaie – Brussels, Edinburgh Festival and most recently the Vienna State Opera and the Deutsche Oper – Berlin (*The Sleeping Beauty* Pepita/Macmillan October 1967).

Exhibited Grosvenor Gallery 1966, Galerie Hammer – Berlin 1967.

Represented in private and public collections including: Victoria and Albert Museum, Felton Bequest, Perth National Gallery.


