Howard Roberts Gallery, Cardiff.


Dillwyn Gallery, Swansea.

In March 1963 he held a one-man exhibition at the National Library of Wales and in February 1964 with Jeffrey Steele at the Manchester College of Art and Design.

He is a lecturer on Art in the University College of Wales, Aberystwyth and has lived in Wales for 14 years.
