# ENRICO BAJ

Born: Milan, 1924

Studied at the Brera Academy and at the same time studied law. In 1951 he pioneered the Nuclear Movement and in 1952 published in Brussels the first Nuclear Manifesto. He has had numerous one-man exhibitions in London, Europe, The United States and the Far East.

## JIRI KOLAR

#### Born: Protivin, Southern Bohemia, 1914

Son of baker and dressmaker, he was apprenticed to a carpenter who lived on the same floor. After the apprenticeship, he found himself out of work and took casual work. He then became interested in poetry and modern art. In 1937 he exhibited 12 collages in an avant-garde theatre in Prague. One of the few Eastern European artists to win international status in the post-war years. In 1942 he and his friends formed the Group 42 where painters, sculptors and poets wanted to integrate the contemporary world into art. The Group broke up after the Communist takeover in 1948 and Kolar was dismissed from his editing job. His interest in collage revived in 1949 and in '62 he exhibited again for the first time since 1937 in Prague, thereafter his reputation grew with speed.

Sandy Sempliner is an American artist who has been working in London for the last nine years. After undergraduate study at The Corcoran School of Art in Washington, D.C. he moved to New York City where he received his M.F.A. from Pratt Institute in 1976. Since then he has been working professionally and began to exhibit in Europe as well as America quite early in his career. Sempliner sees his art as an empirical study of the relationships of colour and composition. In both the paintings and collages similar concerns are explored. In the paintings the imagery is distinctly non-objective and the ideas investigated are done so in an extremely pure manner. The collages also deal with the same concepts in a smaller format but with the didactic addition of found objects. These works are not necessarily narrative but concentrate on the juxtaposition of everyday items presented out of context such that they cease to be banal mementos and begin to work as unusual compositional elements. It is the understated beauty of many otherwise ordinary objects that attracts the artist's eye and leads Sempliner to incorporate them into these works. His influences come from such varied sources as the work of Rothko, Pollock, Schwitters and Whistler; another American expatriate in London. Building on an incorporation of the lessons to be learned from these masters with his own unique vision Sempliner's resulting work is contemplative, complex, colourful and elegant.
